CHILDREN AND TEENS (1-17) Collectively in Oklahoma, the Y serves **135,418** kids and teens, providing a wide range of activities to nurture potential, including teen clubs, sports leagues and community service projects.

LOW-INCOME FAMILIES Our YMCAs provide quality, affordable childcare and open all of our programs to working families regardless of their income level or ability to pay.

Holistic health and well-being programs, small group activities and volunteer opportunities ensure that older adults have every opportunity to connect with one another and engage in meaningful activities.

EVERYONE IS WELCOME Oklahoma Ys provided **\$6,281,116** in direct financial assistance to individuals and families who would otherwise be unable to afford a Y membership or participate in Y programs. An additional **\$2,389,847** in assistance was provided through free and subsidized programs open to the community, school groups and other non-profits.

Oklahoma YMCAs provided **\$305,948** worth of space at little to no charge for outside clubs, nonprofits and community service organizations to help them meet broader community needs.
